



Visas and requirements to visit Mexico

Visas

Participants at Merida Summits (CARICOM and ACS) must complete all migratory formalities to visit Mexico. All participants must possess valid passport and necessary visas, if applicable.

Ordinary passport

Non-ordinary passport

In case you and your family companions (spouse or partners and children) require a visa, please approach your contact in the Mexican Embassy or Consulate, they have received instructions to facilitate your participation and to grant visas.

Immigration facilities

If you are a national of a country which requires a visa, but you hold any of the following documents, you do not need to apply for a Mexican visa:

- a) A permanent resident card in Canada, USA, Japan, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, or in any of the countries of the Schengen Area.
- b) Valid visa from the United States of America.

Entry Formality

Please note that Mexico does not issue visas upon arrival under any circumstance.

At the port of entry into Mexico, please proceed to the Immigration booth, where you must fill a form (FMM) to register your admittance, the immigration official will give you back a tag, that you should keep along with your passport, since you have to give it back at your departure.
