

## Privileged location in the heart of Mexico

- Hidalgo has immediate access to the Metropolitan Area of the Valley of Mexico, the country's main economic, financial, political, and cultural hub.
- Its connectivity covers 11,000 km of highways and more than 800 km of railways..
- This road infrastructure is strategic for accessing the main ports and borders of the country, enabling greater dynamism in the regional economy.



# Highway and railway connectivity

- The Arco Norte Highway, the most significant highway development in the center of the country, has been an important node to boost Hidalgo's connectivity, which links it to Mexico City, and the country's most important industrial ports and centers.

## Logistic node of the CENTER OF THE COUNTRY

According to the study of the National System of Logistics Platforms, Hidalgo is located in the logistics node of the Metropolitan Zone of the Valley of Mexico. Its proximity to the port of Veracruz, the busiest in the Gulf of Mexico, makes of Hidalgo an ideal point for the logistics sector in the center of the country

# Consolidated Sectors



## RAILWAY

The **human talent of Cd. Sahagún** is widely recognized for its high specialization in the manufacturing of railway equipment and materials.



## MINING & CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

**Hidalgo is the country's main producer of manganese** and the second in phosphate exploitation. It has the largest number of cement plants in Mexico (6 plants).



## FREIGHT & PASSENGER TRANSPORTATION

The workforce of Hidalgo has **over 70 years of experience** in the design and manufacturing of buses and freight trucks..

# Consolidated Sectors



## TEXTILE & APPAREL

One of the most dynamic sectors in Hidalgo, **leading in the production of yarns and textile fibers.**



## FOOD & BEVERAGES

**Hidalgo is the 2nd largest producer of barley nationwide** with 249,901 tons, generating income for more than 12,550 producers.

# Emerging Sectors



## E-MOBILITY

**“Giant Motors Latin America”** (with a “Pure Electric” vehicle assembly line) currently operates in Cd. Sahagún with the possibility of incorporating local suppliers for parts and components imported from China.



## ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

The sector is growing, with companies like **Generac** consolidating their presence in the region.



## CLEAN ENERGY

Hidalgo has areas such as **conventional thermoelectric, combined cycle, hydroelectric, photovoltaic, and 2 solar parks** aimed at reducing the carbon footprint.

# Emerging Sectors



## PHARMACEUTICAL

In Hidalgo, **Carnot Laboratories** is building the most modern plant in the country for manufacturing top-quality medicines.

## LOGISTICS

Hidalgo **is connected to the Felipe Ángeles International Airport (AIFA)** and has an Intermodal Terminal where railway lines converge.

# Industrial Infrastructure



## NATURAL GAS

A network of more than **375 km of gas pipelines** across four main branches, plus over 280 km of new pipelines under development.



## WATER

Hidalgo has **21 aquifers with an annual water availability of 176.8 million cubic meters**. The treatment plant in Atotonilco de Tula, is the largest in the world, with a capacity of 42,000 liters per second.



## ELECTRIC POWER

**Hidalgo is the fifth-largest producer of electricity nationwide.** The electric service has an installed capacity of more than 2,200 MVA across 25 main transmission substations and 2 more under construction, adding over 100 MVA.



## TELECOMMUNICATIONS

The largest and most innovative telecommunications system in Latin America is being developed, positioning **Hidalgo among the top 10 nationwide.**




