The wine region of Ensenada extends over ten thousand hectares of cultivation, and has more than seventy wine houses in its different valleys, where ninety percent of the country's wines are produced.

VISIT THE VINE AND WINE MUSEUM

Here, a visitor will get to know and recognize the history of Mexican wine, which began with the arrival of the first European missionaries, and learn about the different types of crops, types of grapes, different forms of production and the vast universe of the renowned digestive beverage.

TASTE THE WINE PROPOSALS OF THE REGION

One can enter the extensive and undulating vineyards to familiarize oneself with both the small family farms that use artisan processes and with large-scale producers. A visitor can enjoy the landscape between the vineyards and olive trees with a wine tasting, accompanied by sophisticated dishes prepared with products of the region of the highest quality: artisan and organic products or jams of unimaginable flavors.

ENJOY A GLOBE RIDE

A tourist may discover, from high up in the air, the radiant green of the valley, the beautiful and stately mission-style haciendas, craft centers, camping areas, and boutique hotels among the endless rows of vines and olive groves that bathe in the dawn's misty freshness. At midday, they shine under the sun's rays, and at night they glitter like the stars.

THE GREAT PARTY OF THE GUADALUPE VALLEY

Celebrate the harvest parties in August along the route and participate in events, wine tastings, gourmet food tastings, competitions, concerts, dances and cultural shows.

MEXICAN STUDENTS WIN 2017 GLOBAL SWEDE AWARDS

On May 10, Ambassador Gasca Pliego attended the 7th edition of the Global Swede Awards, held at the premises of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Sweden. This recognition is awarded by the Swedish government to foreign students who enroll in postgraduate studies in Sweden and who have excelled in areas of innovation and entrepreneurship.

The Ambassador was invited by Ms. Ann Linde, Minister of Commerce and European Affairs, as two Mexican students, Carolina Crespo Uribe and Luis Alejandro Hernandez Renteria, were part of the group of 22 foreign students being honored. The ceremony was chaired by Minister Linde and Ms. Annika Rembe, General Director of the Swedish Institute, with the participation of Ms. Elisa Busa, AstraZeneca Branch Project Director.

Global Swede is part of a long-term project to build and strengthen relations with international students in Sweden, with the aim of creating a platform to promote Swedish trade and benefit international and multicultural cooperation with the collaboration of the Swedish Institute international alumni network. Graduates recognized by Global Swede are part of a broad network of more than 13,000 people from 140 countries. In view of this, the award aims to make distinguished students become "ambassadors" of Sweden in the world, promoting this country as an ideal destination for the completion of postgraduate studies.

I his past May 12, at the Cervantes Institute, the Mexican author Yuri Herrera participated in a seminar with translator Maria Cederroth and Fredrik Uggla to present the new Swedishlanguage translation of his novel *La transmi*gración de los cuerpos ("The Transmigration of Bodies," to be published in Swedish as Kropparnas själavandring).

Herrera arrived in Sweden on May 10 to attend an event in the city of Gothenburg. On May 11, he appeared at the Stockholm Cultural House (Kulturhuset) as part of the "Internationell författarscen" program, where he spoke with Ike Johannesson, a well-known literary journalist. The next day, Herrera spoke at the Instituto Cervantes, where he held the aforementioned dialogue with the translator Maria Cederroth and with Fredrik Uggla, who mo-

derated the evening, and who is a renowned academic from the Institute of Latin American Studies at the University of Stockholm. For over an hour and a half, the three guests talked about Herrera's style, about his inspiration and about the process of translation that, in a work like this one, becomes fundamental for

its understanding in other languages.

This event had high attendance by a very interested public.

This is Yuri Herrera's second novel to be published in Swedish, by the publishing house Nilsson Förlag.

MEXICAN COFFEE IMPORTERS VISIT THE NORDIC COUNTRIES



Ambassador Agustín Gasca Pliego, ProMéxico Commercial Counsellor Carlos Pérez-Cirera, and Mexican Coffee Exporters to the Nordic Countries at the Embassy of Mexico on May 23.

From May 16 to 19, a Mission of Mexican Coffee Exporters to Sweden and Denmark visited the Embassy of Mexico in Stockholm, with the objective of offering their products and diversifying their sales of coffee to the Nordic region.

Mr. Efraín García López, of Mixteca Alta del Pacífico de Oaxaca; Ms. Rocío Adriana Salvador Pérez, of AG Ambiente y Desarrollo de Chiapas; and Ms. Silvia Roblero Torres, of Sierra Verde de Chiapas, had the opportunity to hold several business meetings and visit some of the main coffee importers, with a view to internationalizing their products in the Scandinavian countries.

The work agenda was organized by the Embassy of Mexico in collaboration with the ProMexico Stockholm office, and

it included a visit to the Kahls Kaffe AB coffee factory in Västra Frölunda, Göteborg, as well as various spots in Stockholm: the central office of the Wayne's Coffee chain, the Arvid Nordqvist coffee importer, and business meetings with the coffee distributor and importer Inge Karlsson Handels AB and the coffee company Karma Coffee.

During the meetings with the Swedish companies, the visitors from Chiapas and Oaxaca briefly presented their conventional and organic coffee grain products, certification licenses and a description of their coffee cooperatives. They also expressed interest in selling their coffee in Denmark and Sweden by increasing the consumption of premium quality organic coffee products.

In Sweden, the annual consumption of coffee is over 1.6 million sacks, with a per capita consumption of 10.1 kilos a year. Sweden has the second place in the Scandinavian countries in coffee consumption, after Finland. Certified organic coffee has a greater position in the market, and Sweden is the second-highest importer of certified organic coffee in the European Union. Because of this, coffee import companies seek certifications of environmental sustainability, social responsibility, fair trade, UTZ (sustainable coffee production) and from the Rainforest Alliance.

Finally, representatives of the Mexican coffee cooperatives thanked Ambassador Gasca Pliego and ProMéxico for the efforts made on their behalf in support of this successful visit to Sweden.
