Last month, I had the opportunity to participate in a very important event that highlighted the importance of the economic integration and cooperation between Arizona and Sonora.

The 2016 AMC Summit was held by the Arizona- Mexico Commission, on June 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> in Scottsdale Arizona, where we participated with local, state and federal authorities from both countries.

The event was led by Arizona Governor, Doug Ducey and Sonora Governor, Claudia Pavlovich.

On behalf of the Mexican Government, several Secretaries of State participated: The Secretary of SAGARPA, Jose Calzada Rovirosa; the Secretary of Tourism, Enrique de la Madrid Cordero; the Undersecretary of Energy, Leonardo Beltran Rodriguez; the Head of the International Business and Investment Promotion office of Promexico, Mario Chacon Carrillo and the Secretary of Foreign Affairs, Claudia Ruiz Massieu.

Each of them gave information about the importance of the relationship between Mexico and the US, and they stated the compromise that Mexico has to strengthen the binational relationship in order to develop communities on both sides of the border.

During the closing ceremony, Secretary Claudia Ruiz Massieu emphasized the important contributions of Mexican

nationals in Arizona, and the relevancy of the relationship between Mexico and Arizona.

During her speech, she talked about the importance of trade between Arizona and Mexico: 111,200 jobs in the state depend from this bilateral trade.

She also said that Mexicans represent 70% of tourism in Arizona annually, which leaves generates an economic impact of \$7.3 millions of dollars daily in the State.

## Consular services

The Consulate of Mexico in Tucson can help you issue a particular type of document for certain activities in Mexico:

- **General or Specialized Powers of Attorney.** They are those in which a person gives the authority to another person to act on his or her behalf in one or several legal proceedings. For example: Selling a home, representing the person in a trial or managing a bank account.

If you issued a General or Special Power of Attorney in Mexico or in any Embassy or Consulate of Mexico, you can petition the revocation of the document, as well. In order to do this, you need to bring a certified copy of the Power of Attorney

- **Wills.** These are the documents that deal with a person's personal property and provides a declaration regarding the destination of the belongings after death.
- **Renunciation of an Inheritance.** This document is issued by beneficiaries who wish to relinquish their inheritance rights.

The requirements of these documents are: provide an official ID and payment of the corresponding fees. The cost for Power of Attorneys (and their revocation), as well as Inheritance Rejection Act is \$115 usd. The Public Testament has a cost of \$294 usd

Don't forget that these notary acts are for use only in Mexico.

### |MEETING BETWEEN THE MEXICAN CONSULATE AND IME REPRESENTATIVES

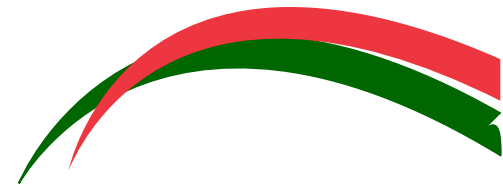
