Mexicans planning a trip to Canada during the 2015 Pan American and Parapan American Games in Toronto can register free of charge in the Registration System for Mexicans Abroad (SIRME, for its initials in Spanish).

The purpose of the registration system is to provide the consulate with your location while you are away from Mexico so that we can assist you in the event of an

emergency. We thus invite you to register, providing your itinerary and address in Canada for the duration of the Toronto Pan American and Parapan American Games.
